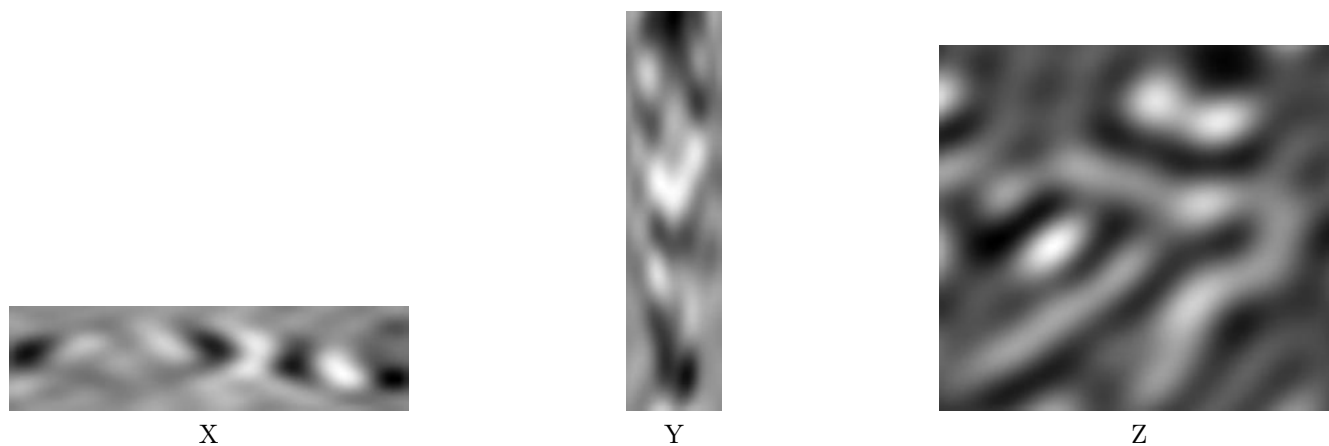
2 Map visualisation [i](#)

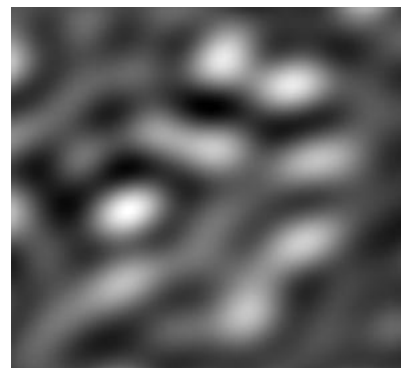

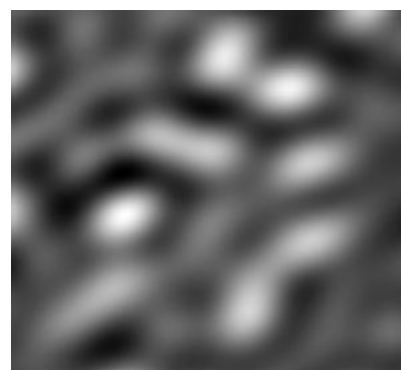

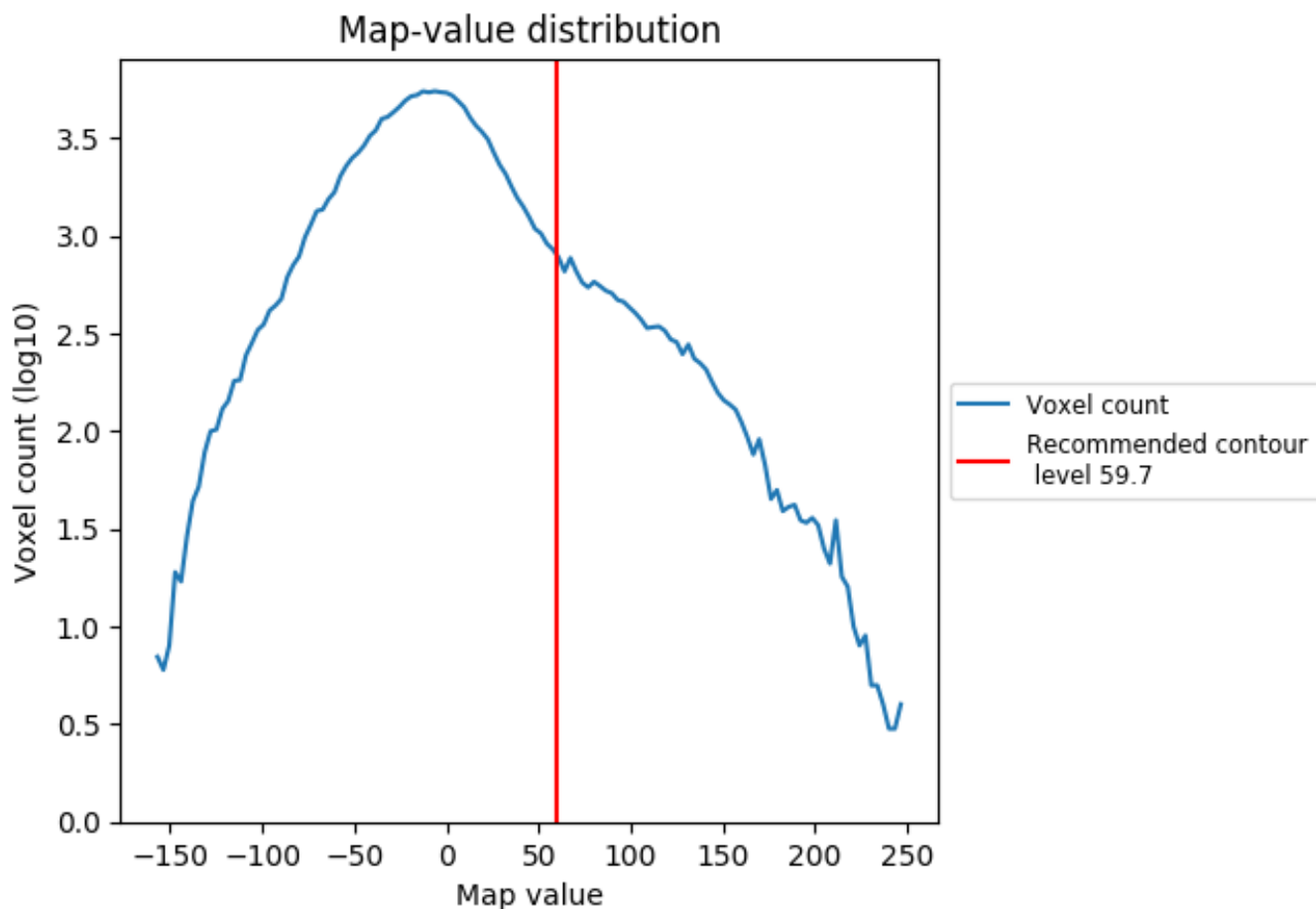

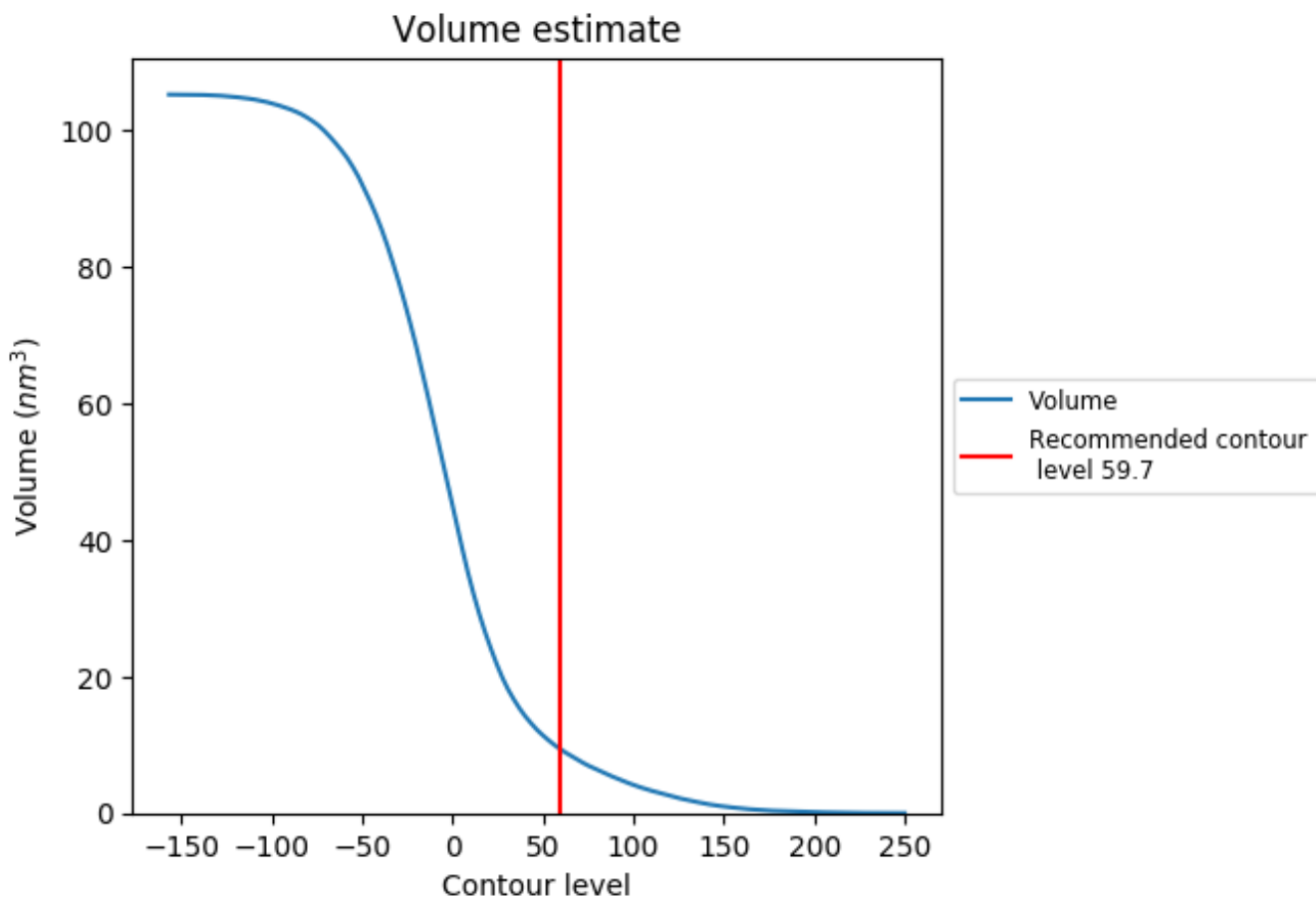
This section contains the results of statistical analysis of the map.

3.1 Map-value distribution [i](#)



The map-value distribution is plotted in 128 intervals along the x-axis. The y-axis is logarithmic. A spike in this graph at zero usually indicates that the volume has been masked.

3.2 Volume estimate [i](#)



The volume at the recommended contour level is 9 nm^3 ; this corresponds to an approximate mass of 8 kDa.

The volume estimate graph shows how the enclosed volume varies with the contour level. The recommended contour level is shown as a vertical line and the intersection between the line and the curve gives the volume of the enclosed surface at the given level.
