1 Overall quality at a glance

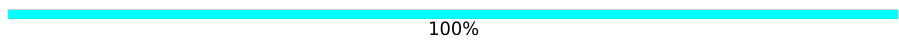
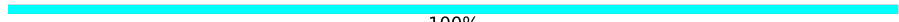
The following experimental techniques were used to determine the structure:

SOLUTION NMR

The overall completeness of chemical shifts assignment was not calculated.

There are no overall percentile quality scores available for this entry.

The table below summarises the geometric issues observed across the polymeric chains and their fit to the experimental data. The red, orange, yellow and green segments indicate the fraction of residues that contain outliers for ≥ 3 , 2, 1 and 0 types of geometric quality criteria. A cyan segment indicates the fraction of residues that are not part of the well-defined cores, and a grey segment represents the fraction of residues that are not modelled. The numeric value for each fraction is indicated below the corresponding segment, with a dot representing fractions $\leq 5\%$

2 Ensemble composition and analysis

This entry contains 2 models. Identification of well-defined residues and clustering analysis are not possible.

3 Entry composition

There is only 1 type of molecule in this entry. The entry contains 758 atoms, of which 272 are hydrogens and 0 are deuteriums.

- Molecule 1 is a DNA chain called 5'-D(*CP*GP*CP*GP*AP*AP*TP*TP*CP*GP*CP*G)-3'.

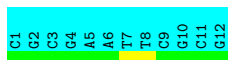
4 Residue-property plots

4.1 Average score per residue in the NMR ensemble

These plots are provided for all protein, RNA, DNA and oligosaccharide chains in the entry. The first graphic is the same as shown in the summary in section 1 of this report. The second graphic shows the sequence where residues are colour-coded according to the number of geometric quality criteria for which they contain at least one outlier: green = 0, yellow = 1, orange = 2 and red = 3 or more. Stretches of 2 or more consecutive residues without any outliers are shown as green connectors. Residues which are classified as ill-defined in the NMR ensemble, are shown in cyan with an underline colour-coded according to the previous scheme. Residues which were present in the experimental sample, but not modelled in the final structure are shown in grey.

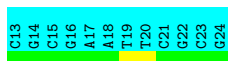

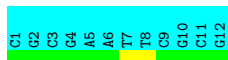

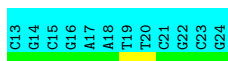

5 Refinement protocol and experimental data overview

The models were refined using the following method: *SIMULATED ANNEALING IN TORSION ANGLE SPACE USING A SIXTH ORDER PREDICTOR-CORRECTOR METHOD WITH AUTOMATIC TIME STEP SELECTION (C. SCHWIETERS AND G.M. CLORE)*.

Of the 40 calculated structures, 2 were deposited, based on the following criterion: *THE RESTRAINED REGULARIZED MEAN STRUCTURES*.
