A grey segment represents the fraction of residues that are not modelled. The numeric value for each fraction is indicated below the corresponding segment, with a dot representing fractions  $\leq 5\%$ . The upper red bar (where present) indicates the fraction of residues that have poor fit to the EM map (all-atom inclusion  $< 40\%$ ). The numeric value is given above the bar.

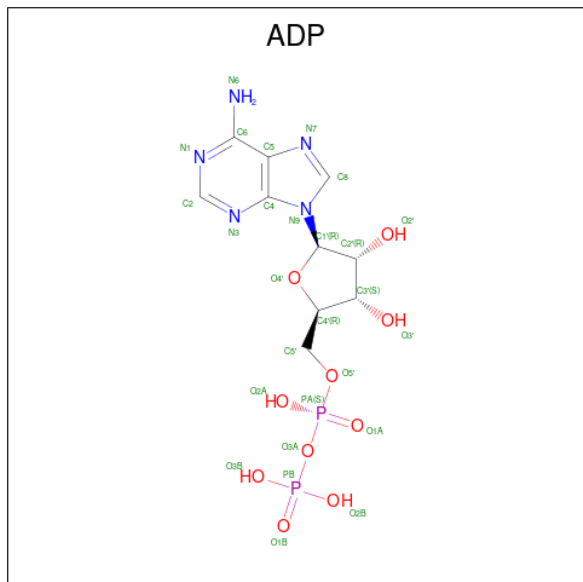

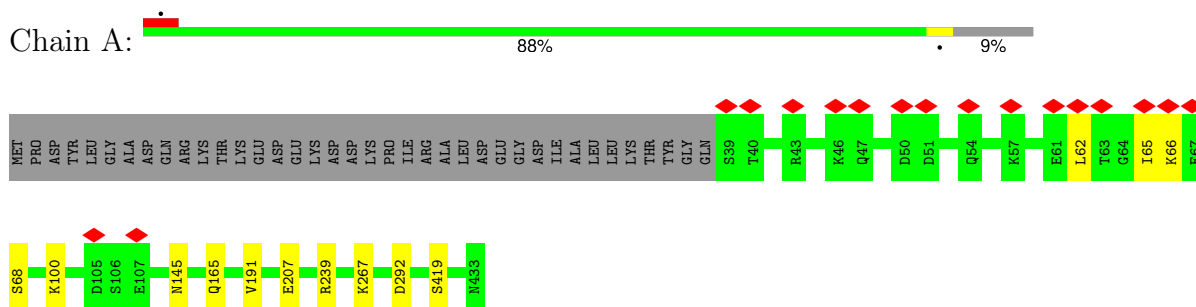

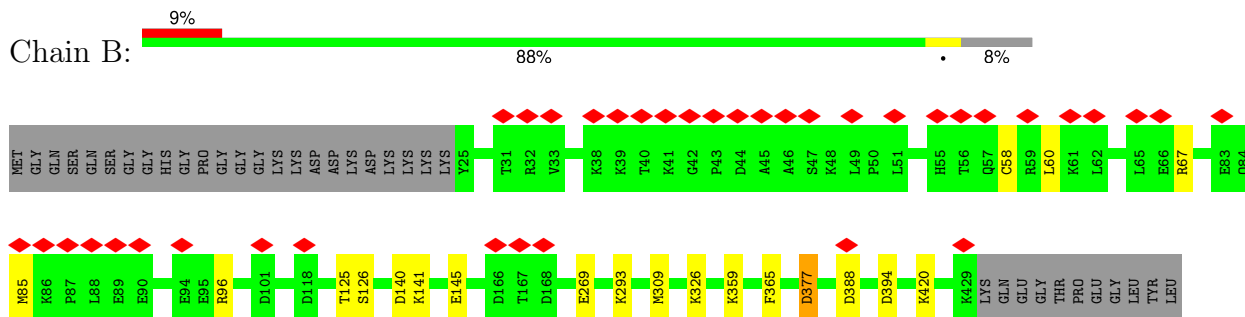
### 3 Residue-property plots [i](#)

These plots are drawn for all protein, RNA, DNA and oligosaccharide chains in the entry. The first graphic for a chain summarises the proportions of the various outlier classes displayed in the second graphic. The second graphic shows the sequence view annotated by issues in geometry and atom inclusion in map density. Residues are color-coded according to the number of geometric quality criteria for which they contain at least one outlier: green = 0, yellow = 1, orange = 2 and red = 3 or more. A red diamond above a residue indicates a poor fit to the EM map for this residue (all-atom inclusion < 40%). Stretches of 2 or more consecutive residues without any outlier are shown as a green connector. Residues present in the sample, but not in the model, are shown in grey.

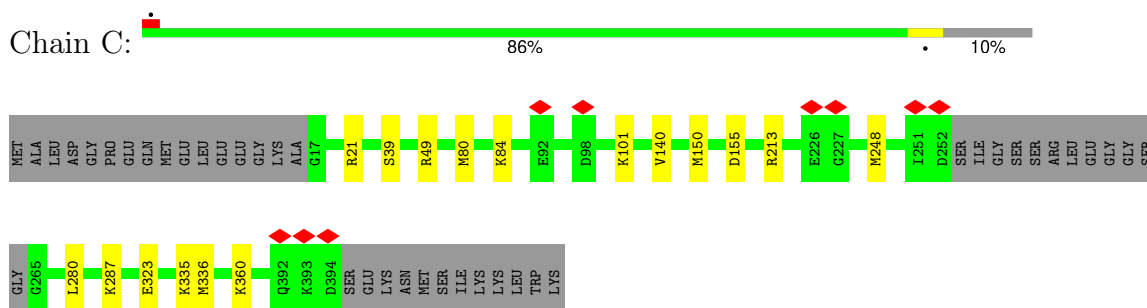
- Molecule 1: 26S proteasome regulatory subunit 7



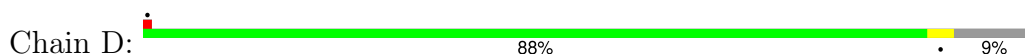
- Molecule 2: 26S proteasome regulatory subunit 4

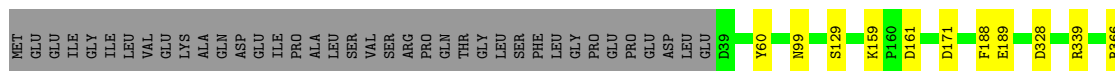


- Molecule 3: 26S protease regulatory subunit 8

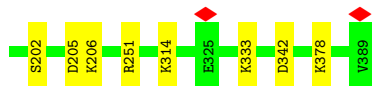
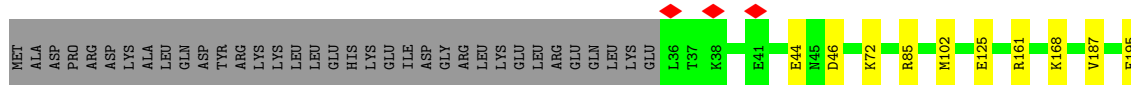
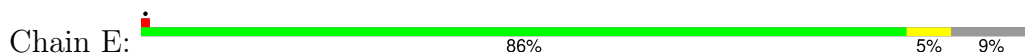

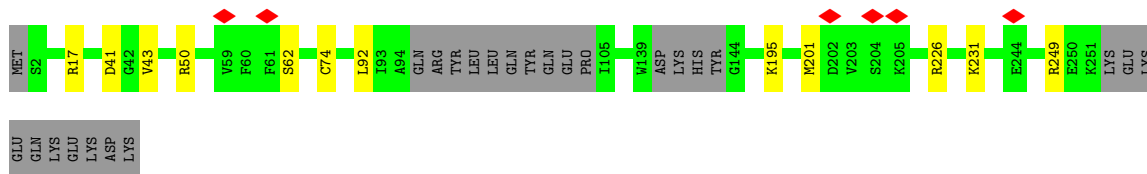


• Molecule 8: Proteasome subunit alpha type-2

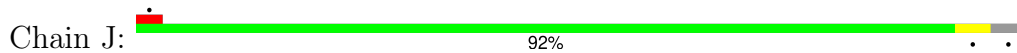

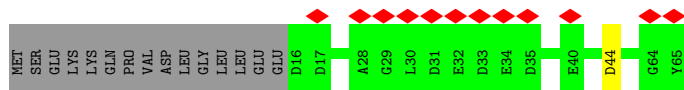
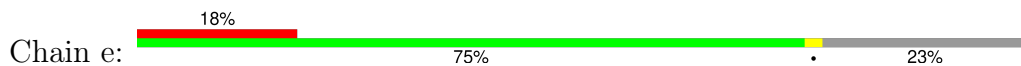




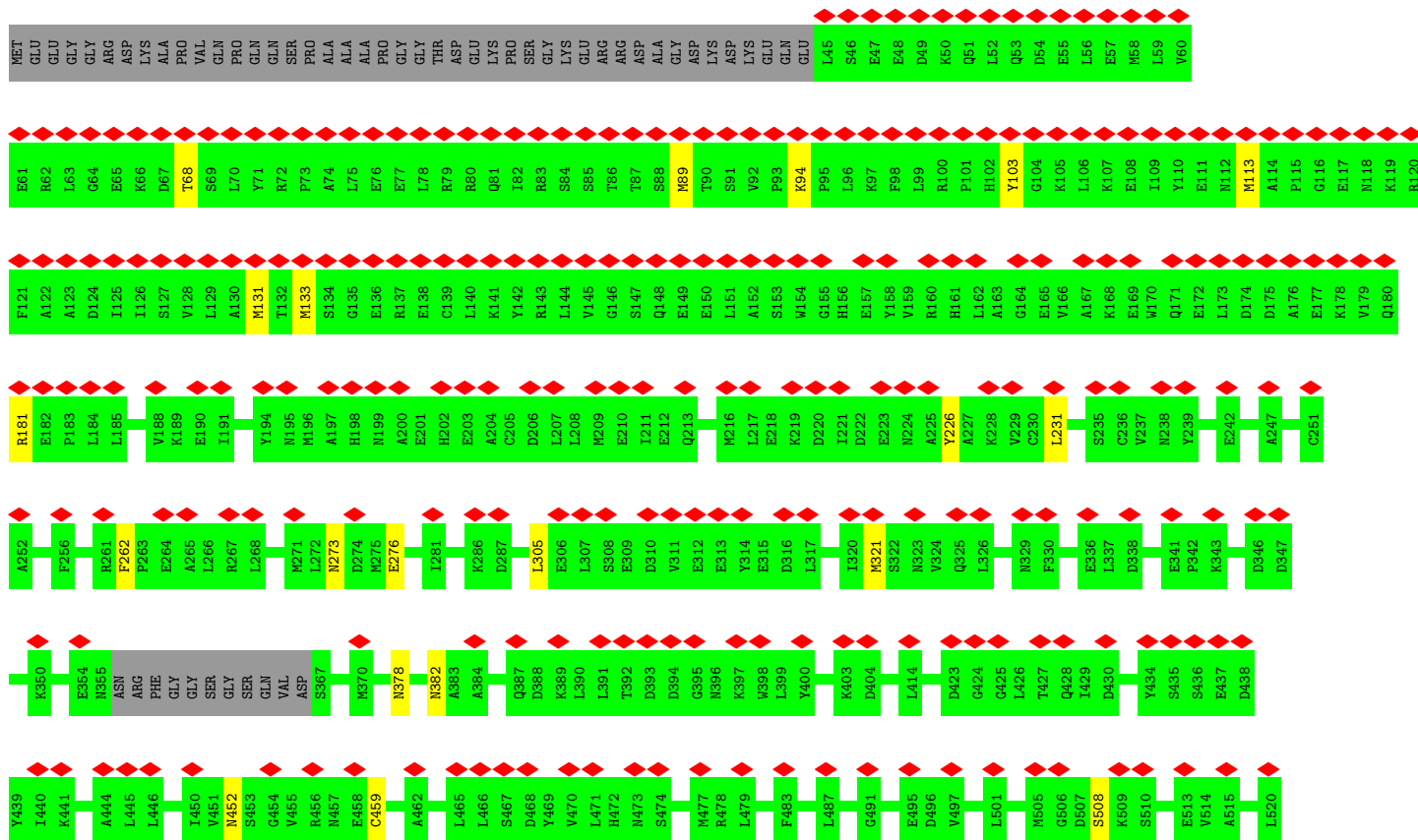
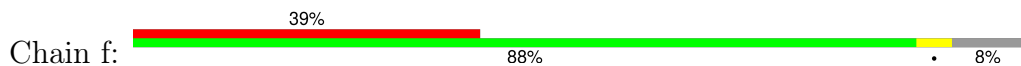




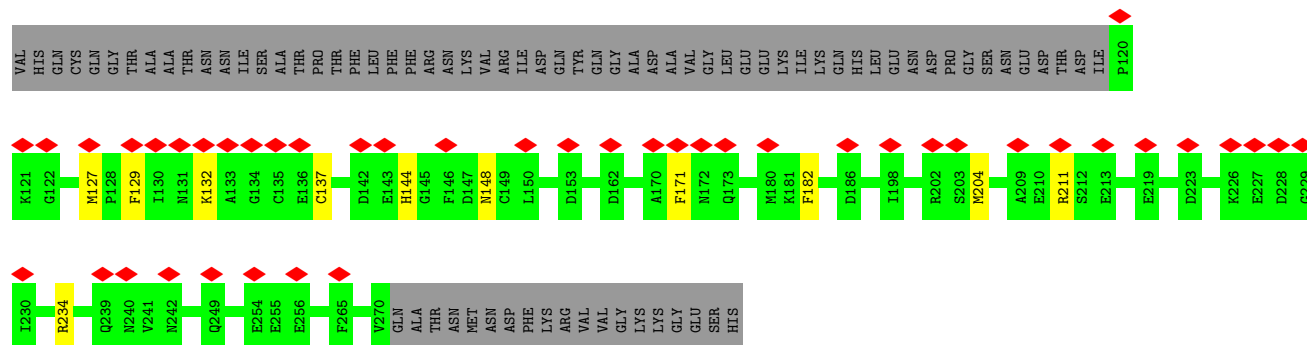
• Molecule 24: 26S proteasome complex subunit SEM1

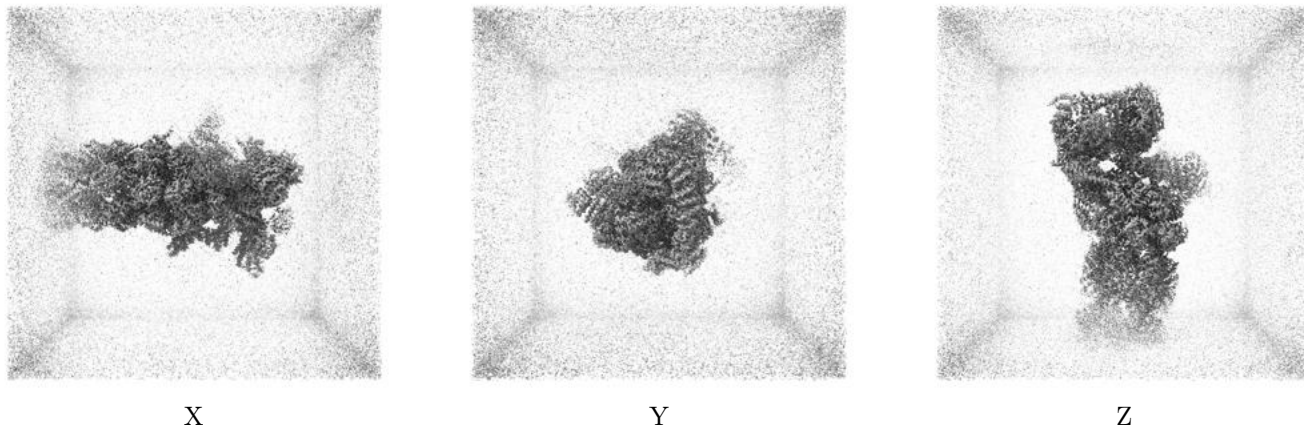

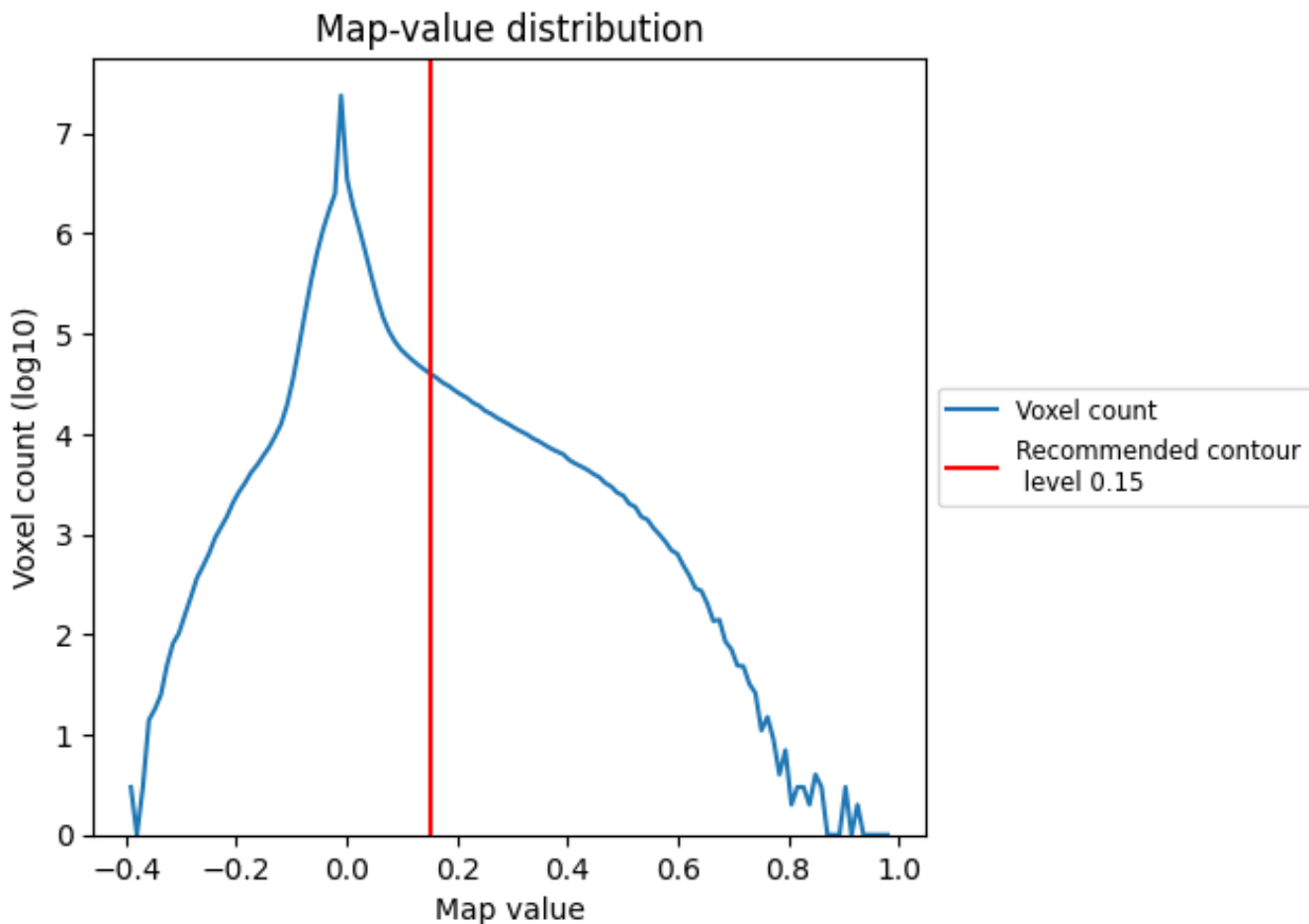

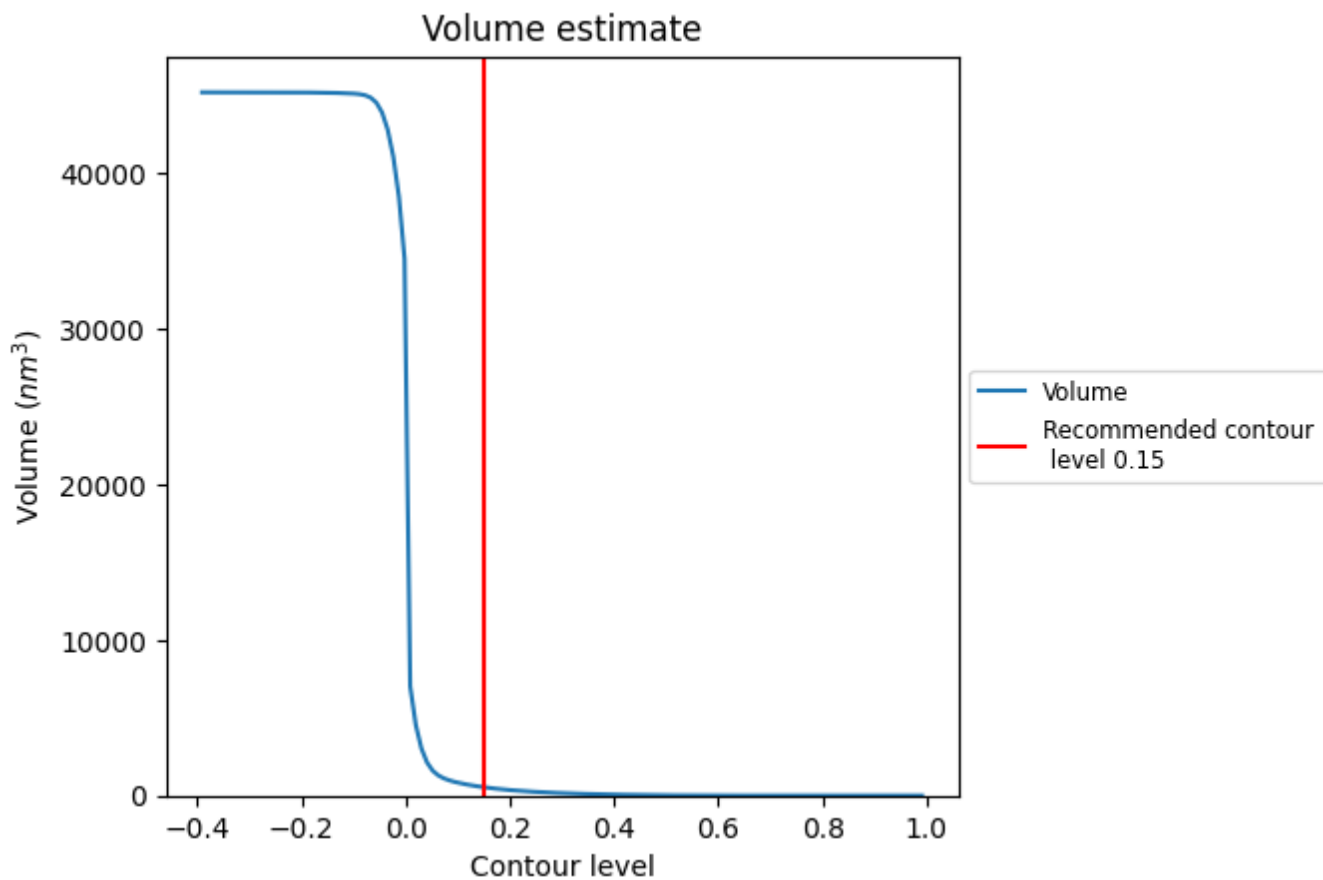

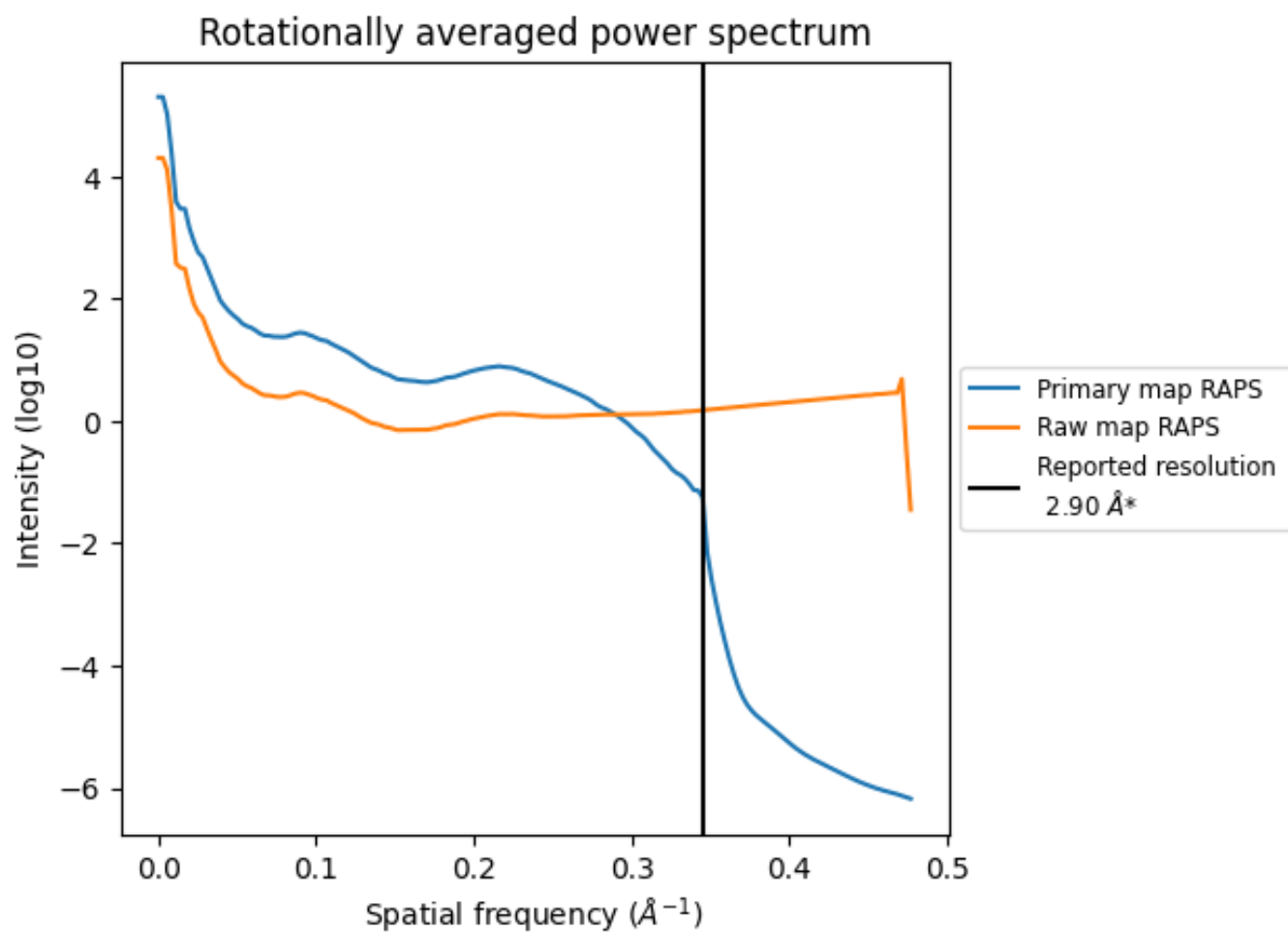

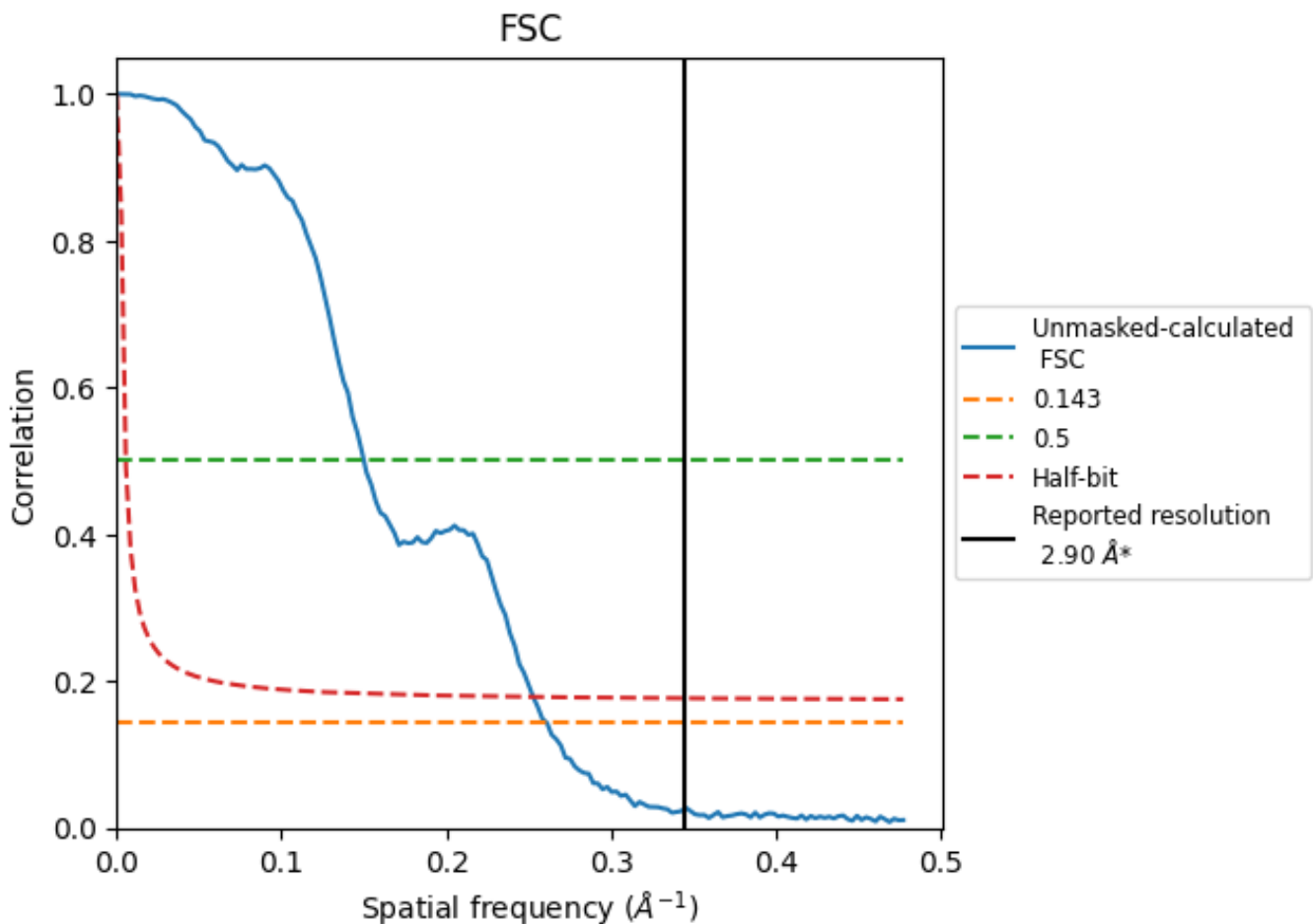

## 8 Fourier-Shell correlation [i](#)

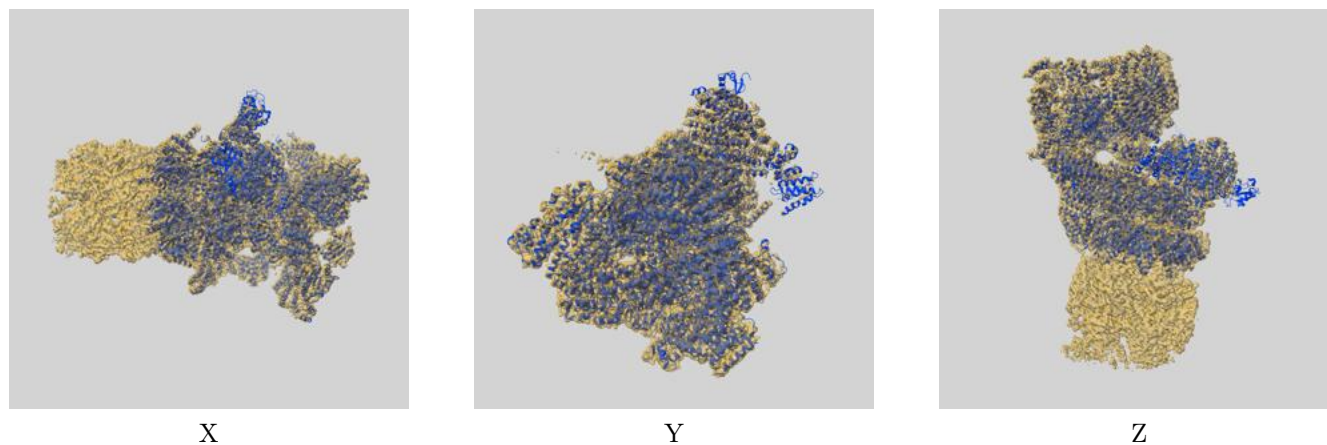

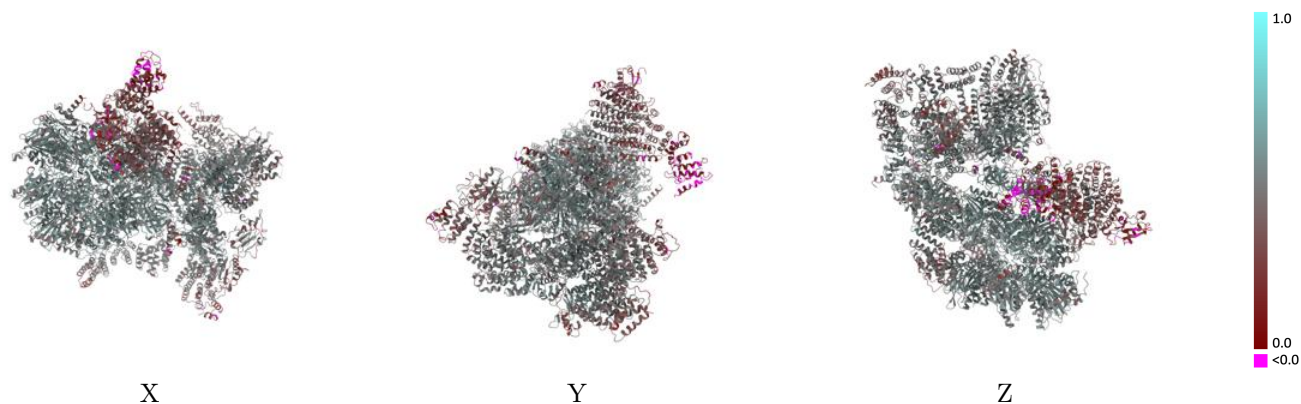

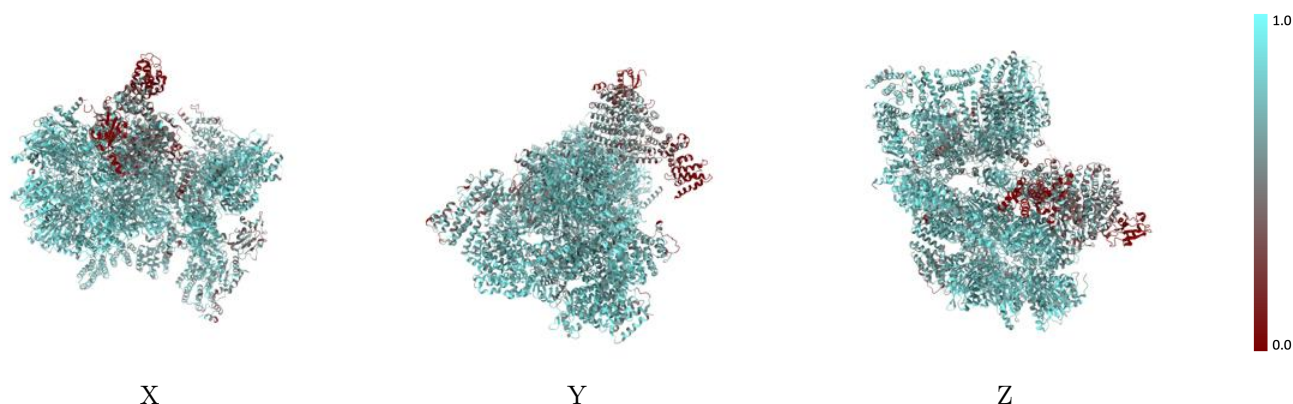

## 9.2 Q-score mapped to coordinate model [i](#)



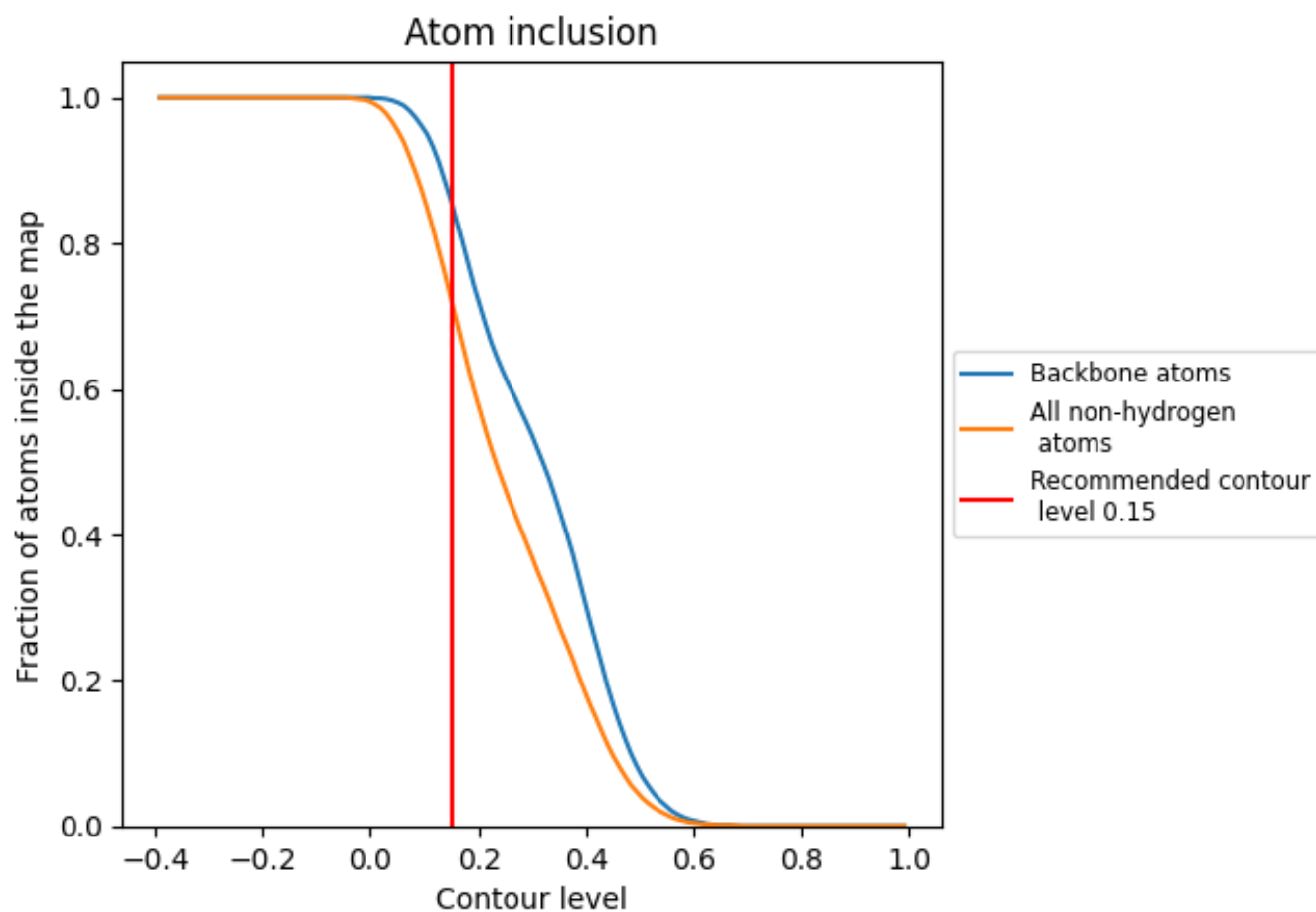

The images above show the model with each residue coloured according to its atom inclusion. This shows to what extent they are inside the map at the recommended contour level (0.15).

























































## 9.4 Atom inclusion [i](#)



At the recommended contour level, 86% of all backbone atoms, 72% of all non-hydrogen atoms, are inside the map.
